An update on the Manitoba Jobs Agreement (MJA) was provided, noting that key concerns from ECAM and MCAM were discussed with the MJA team. Next steps include a follow-up meeting in 2026 and requests for volunteers to participate in interviews regarding price ranges and affected projects.

Apprenticeship Ratio Adjustments

Data collection on apprenticeship ratios will continue over 2026. Contractors are encouraged to apply for ratio adjustments through Apprenticeship Manitoba to help inform the data collection.

The “Building a Sexual Harassment-Free Workplace in Electricity” course will be held on January 28, 2026, from 9:30 AM to 3:00 PM at the ECAM office. This one-day training offers two evidence-informed modules designed to equip leaders with skills to manage, investigate, and respond to workplace complaints. Energy Code Acceleration

Code Acceleration Stakeholder Engagement Committee (CASEC) - Dunskey Energy + Climate Advisors completed a market assessment to support Manitoba’s plan to advance energy-efficiency tiers. They recommend aligning tier increases with the national model code’s five-year update cycle. The 2025 codes are expected in December 2025, and Manitoba must adopt them within 18 months.

Platform Ladders on Jobsites

The board discussed the increasing use of platform ladders on jobsites and agreed to engage with the Canadian Construction Safety Council (CCSC) on a semi-annual basis to support ongoing communication and collaboration.
