# **February Board of Directors Meeting Highlights**

The ECAM Board of Directors is comprised of a cross section of Industry members; residential, industrial, commercial, urban and rural, sub-contractors, engineers and associate members. The Board meets monthly September through June and is served by standing committees, advisory councils and working groups.

#### **WCB Petition for Lost Time**

An update was provided on discussions regarding the petition for lost time, including the proposal of a grace period before lost time calculation begins. Consultations are ongoing with relevant industry and regulatory organizations to analyze lost time ratios across different provinces. As the Workers Compensation Act mandates a review every 10 years, with the next review scheduled for 2026, the Board intends to advocate for changes to the lost time ratio.

Design Consultants Advisory Council Update
The first meeting of the newly formed council was held in January, focusing on improving communication between contractors and engineers. Gord Whiffen from SMS Engineering was introduced as the future representative for the Design Consultants on the ECAM Board of Directors.

### **Builder's Lein Modernization Committee**

Ramona Coey, Executive Director provided an update on the progress of the Builder's Lien Modernization Committee. Two regulations have been completed, and several industry associations have submitted an application to the Province to establish an adjudication authority. The application, which includes a request for \$350,000 in seed funding, is currently under review by the Treasury Board. The implementation date is set for April 1st, after which any contracts signed will be subject to adjudication. A website is in development, and an application for articles of incorporation has been submitted. Once approved, a list of adjudicators will be established along with a fee structure. The Executive Director requested board members to suggest potential adjudicators, with several names put forward for consideration.

## **Energy Tiers in Building Code**

Executive Director, Ramona Coey will represent ECAM on the Minister's committee responsible for making recommendations regarding the adoption of energy tiers within Manitoba's building code. Scott Hammond from SMS engineering will serve as representative of MCAM.

# **ECAM Withdrawal from CECA**

An official email was sent to CECA notifying them of ECAM's withdrawal from membership. The new chair, Terry Milot, informed Ramona Coey that Ontario would be joining CECA and that efforts were underway to realign the dues structure. CECA will be based in Ontario and will adopt a new mission statement and bylaws, with plans to continue addressing national issues. ECAM continues work with MCAC exploring a dual trade collaboration.
