The Board meets monthly September through June and is served by standing committees, advisory councils and working groups.

CSAM Update: WCB Assessment & Industry Safety Standards

Sean Scott, Executive Director, and Bob Craddock from the Construction Safety Association of Manitoba presented their annual classification report specific to the electrical contracting sector. Their presentation provided an overview of the Workers Compensation Board (WCB) assessment rate framework, outlining how rates are established through industry-wide budgeting and are released annually in October. The board had a thoughtful discussion of loss time incident reports in relation to other Canadian jurisdictions.

Trade Talk - November 3, 2025

The Board discussed the success of the October Trade Talk on delay claims with Shawn Henry, highlighting the open dialogue it encouraged among attendees. These sessions will continue monthly on the first Monday, with the next scheduled for November 3. Stay tuned for updates.
